Practical Information

Preopening and opening of the Danish pavilion

- Preview of the Danish pavilion can take place on Thursday 20 May at 10.00 -19.00.
- The official opening of the Danish pavilion will take place on Friday May 21 (time unknown due to central coordination from the Biennale Administration). Friday May 21, the Danish pavilion will be available for preview. This should apply to the other pavilions to the extent they are completed.
- The official opening of the International Architecture Exhibition of La Biennale di Venezia to the public will take place on Saturday 22 May.
- Pre-openings / opening events will take place outdoors. The weather and temperatures in Venice at this time of year can be changeable. We therefore encourage everyone to bring suitable outerwear and umbrella (can be used as a parasol too) to the arrangement.
- For COVID-19 reasons, there is a separate entrance and exit in the Danish pavilion.

Entry into Italy

- Upon arrival in Italy, you must be able to present a valid, negative, max.
 72/48 hours old corona test to enter the country, as well as enter the Biennale area. This can change close to settlement. Information can be found here: https://infocovid.viaggiaresicuri.it/index_en.html
- The traveling foreign business traveller can stay in Italy for a maximum of 120 hours (5 days) without having to quarantine on arrival in Italy.

Access to the Giardini / Biennale area and opening of the Danish pavilion

- To enter the Giardini / Biennale area, you must be able to present a valid, negative, max 72/48 hours old COVID-19 test, and printed invitation to preopening, as well as your passport.
- Guests will have their temperature taken at the entrance to the Giardini and Arsenale (as in summer 2020) and face mask must be worn.
- The distance restrictions are at least 1 meter.
- Upon receipt of the invitation, guests may be asked to complete paperwork with personal health information and travel details for COVID-19 reasons.
